MOVING WITH PETS



PRE-MOVE

UPDATE TAG

Get a new collar with an easy-to-read name and number with your new address and contact details.

OBTAIN VETERINARIAN RECORDS

Procure your current vet records so you can transfer them to your new pet's doctor.

GET YOUR PET USED TO BOXES

Help your pet adjust to the moving process by bringing in moving boxes early and keeping them in the last room you plan to pack up.

KEEP THEIR ROUTINE

Maintain consistent feeding, walks and playtime to keep your pet's stress levels low.

DURING MOVE

PREPARE AN OVERNIGHT KIT

Compile an easily accessible "overnight kit" with enough food, kitty litter, toys, grooming tools and medication to keep your pet comfortable for the first few days of unpacking.

KEEP A COMFORTABLE, SECLUDED SPACE FOR YOUR PET

Place dogs or cats in a quiet room with a door that can be closed during move-out and move-in. Include their blanket, toy and crate. Make sure they can hear you so they don't feel abandoned.

PET-PROOF YOUR HOME

Secure windows, gates and doors. Check for pest control traps left behind and remove/isolate any potentially harmful plants in the yard.

POST-MOVE

INTRODUCE THEM SLOWLY

Once you arrive, give your pet time to sniff around and explore their new surroundings at their own pace.

KEEP THEIR ROUTINE

The sooner you return to your normal daily routine, the faster your pet will feel settled.

LOVE AND CARE

Give your pet plenty of positive attention and reassurance. If your schedule allows, consider staying home more during the first week to help them adjust.
