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

1. WHALE WATCHING

Orcas, humpbacks, gray or minke are some of the whales you might see on a whale watching tour.

Puget Sound Express

has three departure locations and options of half-day, full day or multi-day tours. Local whale sighting network Orca Network is a great resource too!

2. BEACH

You haven't truly explored the Pacific Northwest (PNW) until you set foot on the beaches. Most are rocky, but there are sandy areas. Hit them at low tide and you will find live sand dollars, shellfish, sea stars, crabs and possibly see some jellyfish, harbor seals and orcas as they float on by. There are several spots to choose from. The DeMolay Sandspit Nature Preserve located on the west end of Fox Island is a great place to start roaming & dogs are allowed!

3. MOUNTAINS

53 Bella Bella Dr. Fox Island

Take a drive up to **Mount Rainier** or Mount Saint Helens. There are several places to hike, explore and learn about these gigantic volcanoes. Ride the gondola or the adventure course at Crystal Mountain. If winter sports are more your thing you have several mountain passes to choose from to go skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing or inner tubing.

4. GO FLOAT

You can't truly experience the PNW until you get out on the water. Whether it is on a kayak, Stand Up Paddle Boards (SUP) or boat, there are several choices.

Deadman's Island Kayak & SUP provides tours throughout the area or rentals, including delivery.

Circumnavigate multiple islands and explore the bridges!

Rental is located at the north end of the harbor you can rent kayaks, SUP or even a pedal boat. Snag one and go visit the lighthouse, at the mouth of the harbor which is only accessible by water. 8829 N Harborview Dr (May - end of Summer)

5. UNDERWATER KINGDOM

Learn more about the underwater kingdom from the people who work with these creatures every day. From octopus to touch tanks, there is so much to learn about marine life. Harbor Wildwatch in Gig Harbor hosts several marine life education programs. At their interpretive center, they have touch tanks, marine mammal skulls & a live underwater video stream

Also check out SEA Discovery WILDWATCH Center (Poulsbo), Point Defiance Aquarium (Tacoma).

6. LIGHTHOUSES

Lighthouses have a fascinating history. There are several to tour throughout the Washington coastline, some are conveniently located, while others require a hike, and all have spectacular views.

7. DISCOVER THE ISLANDS

Some islands you can access by bridge, while others are boat only (private or ferry). Two larger islands that provide many activities are Bainbridge & Vashon Island.

You can take the ferry to Vashon Island. You can visit **Point Robinson** Lighthouse, a winery



(Nashi Orchards), hike Frog Holler Forest, visit a brewery or a sandy beach (KVI beach).

Bainbridge Island is accessible by ferry or bridge. You can expect great views and beaches, a charming downtown

with a variety of shops & restaurants with a very rich art culture.





8. DIVE THE WATERS

If you're ready for underwater adventures, try scuba diving. If you're new or experienced, Tacoma Scuba provides everything you need.



SCUBA

If you already have skills and gear, check out Sunrise Beach on the east side of Gig Harbor or under the Tacoma Narrows Bridge (accessible from Narrows Beach). Wolf eels, giant octopus and mosshead warbonnets frequent this location.

If you're up for a little drive, check out Octopus Gardens **Diving** in Port Townsend. A little over an hour drive from Gig Harbor.

9. WATERFALLS:

Dickerson Creek Waterfall, just a 25 minute drive north of Gig Harbor, in Bremerton on the **Ueland Tree Farm.** From the parking lot, there is an easy hike (1.6 miles roundtrip) to a rewarding waterfall that allows you to swim. There are many trails available to explore and dogs are allowed. The public access allows

you to hike, mountain bike, horseback ride and pick berries or mushrooms. If you haven't been, put this on your bucket list!

13. SPLASH YOUR WAY **THROUGH SUMMER**

As the days grow warmer, everyone hunts for a way to cool off. Splash parks are a convenient way to keep the kiddos active and cool at the same time. On the Key Peninsula, Gateway Park has a splash pad open Memorial Day -Labor Day.

Just across the bridge in Tacoma is **Titlow Park** (8425 6th Ave) equipped with a large splash pad, playground & beach access. Kandle Park (2323 N Shirley St) has a spray ground & wave pool which is a summer win for all!

14. GO JUMP IN A LAKE!

Looking for some freshwater options to cool off? Just outside of Gig Harbor is Horseshoe Lake. Bring your floaties! This park is popular in the summer as it has a playground, picnic tables w/BBQ stations, restrooms, and a dock to jump off. Nearby Wildcat Lake in Bremerton has similar facilities.

Looking for adventure on bigger lakes that support motorboats? Venture out a bit further to Mason Lake and Lake Cushman. If you go to Lake Cushman, you can go to the west end to jump off cliffs (a popular attraction), hike Staircase Rapids Trail (no dogs) or camp at Skokomish Park. You are bound to have an epic time in the summer at a lake!

15. RIDE THE GONDOLA

Enjoy a classic Italian gondola ride in traditional venetian gondolas, the only one in the Pacific Northwest. Hear about some history

of Gig Harbor and delight in the vocal stylings, as your gondolier takes you **GH GONDOLA** around the harbor. Afterwards, enjoy some fish & chips from The Trolley at The Boatyard. (3119 Harborview Dr.)

16. LEARN TO SAIL

Get out on the water and feel the wind in your hair with Puget Sound Sailing Institute. The **American Sailing Association** classes are held at different locations. Check out their website for details.

17. RENT A BOAT

There is no better way to experience the Puget Sound than on the water. In Gig Harbor, you can rent a classic boat from Gig Harbor

PARKS

18. STROLL THE DOCKS

Eating some ice cream while strolling the docks is great way to enjoy an afternoon and there are several to choose from:

Gig Harbor - Jerisich Dock 3215 Harborview Dr

Key Peninsula - Penrose & Joemma State Park (Discover Pass required) Poulsbo-Liberty Bay Waterfront Park **Tacoma- Ruston Way Waterfront** Port Orchard, Bremerton, Silverdale, Manchester and more have waterfront strolls that are wonderful too!

19. BIOLUMINESCENCE

Book a Bioluminescence tour and paddle around in beautiful Port Gamble Bay. Bioluminescence is an amazing natural phenomenon in which an organism produces and emits light due to a chemical reaction where the chemical energy is converted into light energy. When disturbed the organisms give off light such as when you paddle a kayak. There are limited nights when this is conducted, so book your tour early.

20. WANDER REMOTE ISLANDS

Intrigued by the small islands around us? Cutts Island State Park is .5 miles NW of Kopachuck State Park and can only be accessed by boat. Locals call this Deadman's Island, and it is a popular spot on a hot sunny day. You can raft up and explore the 2 acres, but there is no camping available.

Blake Island State Park lies east of Port Orchard and is only accessible by boat. On the northeast end of the island is a marina. Many will launch at Manchester and boat over. There are hiking trails, pack in/out campgrounds (w/bathrooms) and a fantastic sandy beach with views of Seattle. The east side has incredible views of Mt. Rainer.

Eagle Island State Park is a 10acre marine park in south Puget Sound only accessible by boat (launch out of Longbranch). The island is in Balch Passage between McNeil and Anderson Island. There are a few mooring bouys or you

can beach it. This tranguil location has a great beach, some trails and a stunning view of Mt. Rainer.

21. UNIQUE QUARTERS

Book a stay on a cozy classic yacht in downtown Gig Harbor. Several boats available. They are all located at a historic net shed and dock on the south end of the harbor. Enjoy the use of their kayaks and explore the harbor. Level up: Throw a murder mystery dinner party into one. Now that sounds fun!!! Look for host Michelle on airbnb.com



22. LIVE MUSIC

Summer Sounds, a free public concert at Skansie Brothers Park in downtown Gig Harbor is a wonderful way to enjoy the harbor. From July 8-Aug 26th, a concert is scheduled every Tuesday 6-8pm. Bring your lawn chair or boat on up and enjoy the sounds from the Sound. Scan the QR code to get the details.



23. FESTIVALS

Come see why we love Gig Harbor! The **Maritime Gig Festival** (6/7 & 8)

is an annual celebration with a packed weekend of fun activities. There is a parade on Saturday morning, several vendor booths, live music and many activities throughout the weekend including Blessing of the Fleet & a classic Car Show. Held at Skansie Park on the waterfront. (First Saturday and Sunday of June each year)

Gig Harbor Film Festival is one of the hottest destinations on the independent film festival circuit - it hosts more than 80 visiting filmmakers & screens over 100 films. (Last weekend in September)

and elevation changes.

25. FOOT FERRY

Got an afternoon free? Here's a great way to spend it...take the foot ferry from downtown **Port Orchard** to Bremerton. With views of the Olympic Mountains & battle ships, you can't go wrong with a ferry ride across **Sinclair Inlet.**

If you're lucky, they might be running the refurbished Carlisle II, built in 1917 as part of the Puget Sound Mosquito Fleet.

Bremerton has a great spray ground park to hang out in or stroll through downtown Port Orchard and enjoy their shops & restaurants.

Tip: Great times to go are Saturdays from April-October during **Port Orchards Farmers Market!**

26. SADDLE-UP

If you're interested in learning how to ride or strengthen your skills, we are lucky to have so many wonderful stables in our area to choose from.

Pets Galore Horse Rides is located just north of Gig Harbor in Olalla. They have a 25 acre private horse park with 3 miles of trails weaving throughout and an outside arena for horse games, jumping, drill team and lessons.

Fox Island Equestrian is a facility offering boarding, horse training, riding lessons, Summer pony camp, music with the ponies,

29. OUTDOOR MOVIES

About 400 drive-ins remain in the US and we have one just 25 minutes away from Gig Harbor, Rodeo Drive-In. They have 3 screens and are the largest outdoor theatre complex, north of California, and by far the largest and oldest family-owned drive-in in the RODEO northwest. (Near Bremerton Airport)



30. TAKE A FARM TOUR

Farm tours provide an opportunity for the public to visit multiple farms across in a one-day, self-guided tour.

Crescent Valley Lavender Farm is a local family-owned farm that grows

premium lavender. Open to the public, during peak season (mid-June to end of July), they offer you-cut harvesting along with



locally made botanical product line infused with the farm's lavender.

31. WATCH SOARING EAGLES

Here's another PNW treat, Billy Frank **Jr. Nisqually National Wildlife** Refuge. One of the most unique wildlife refuges in our backyard! A beautiful place to explore as it offers a long and well-maintained wooden path through the forest and over the wetlands. They suggest visiting

2 hours before high tide as the wildlife is most active. (No pets allowed, \$3 fee for parking/ trail access, 35 minutes from Gig Harbor)

32. SUSPENSION BRIDGE

Stroll or bike the Tacoma Narrows Bridge and enjoy spectacular views of the Puget Sound including Steilacoom Ferry Dock, Ketron & Fox Island. Bring a jacket because it can get windy!

33. JOURNEY THROUGH **GARDENS**

Need to slow down and exhale a bit? Bloedel Reserve. located on Bainbridge Island, is the perfect setting. It is 150 acres of preserved sanctuary. Explore the moss gardens, meadows, marshes or woodland trails. Afterwards, go downtown Bainbridge and enjoy the shops. (50 min from Gig Harbor)

Lakewold Gardens is another treasured spot. It's full of hidden

spaces to experience while you explore various gardening styles. They often have events for the public. (30 min from Gig Harbor)

May is the best time to view our state flower rhododendrons. Take an afternoon stroll through the Rhododendron Species **Botanical Garden** in Federal Way. (30 min from Gig Harbor)

Visit the Rhododendron Garden at Point Defiance Park, just over the bridge. Over 500 Rhododendron plants are here in this beautiful park. When they are in bloom, it's like a fireworks display!

If you want to stay more local, visit Rosedale Gardens. This nursery has a beautiful landscape of trees, plants, and decor.

Sculptures are positioned throughout, with paths going everywhere...they have set this place up in such a fun way, it's a hit with kids.

Also, check out the annual Gig Harbor Garden Tour. Tickets go on sale Memorial Day Weekend. A self-guided tour through Gig Harbor's most luxurious private gardens.

39. BEST PLACES TO PLAY **PICKLEBALL/TENNIS**

Looking for some good places to play pickleball or tennis? Here are two spots the locals like to go...

Crescent Creek Park located near downtown Gig Harbor has 1 tennis court lined for 4 pickleball courts. (3303 Vernhardson Street)

Sehmel Homestead Park has many amenities including 2 outdoor tennis courts lined for 8 pickleball courts AND 1 basketball court line for 4 pickleball courts. Bring your own nets and equipment for pickleball. (10123 78th Ave NW)

Note: YMCA & PenMet Rec Center will be available soon.

40. EXPLORE THE LOCAL FOOD SCENE

These Gig Harbor restaurants have built a serious name for themselves Devoted Kiss Cafe has been voted best breakfast numerous times and might just have the best view in town too! (8809 N. Harborview Drive #203) Situated over the water, Net Shed No.9 is a phenomenal option for breakfast or lunch. (3313 Harborview Dr.) Pull your boat up to the infamous Tides Tavern and order a burger. Need real authentic Texas BBQ? You won't believe how great BBQ2U brisket is. Don't forget to order their mac-n-cheese! (4814 Point Fosdick Dr)

41. CHUTES & LADDERS

The **Dune Peninsula** is tucked in between Ruston Way & Point Defiance. This location has a lot to offer and a great way to spend a sunny day with the family, not to mention it has amazing views of Commencement Bay, Mount Rainier, Vashon Island, and more.

Park at Point Defiance Natural **Preserve Park** to enjoy the ducks and turtles, then take the Wilson Way Bridge east towards Ruston Way.

Chutes & Ladders Anyone? Once you cross the bridge near the ferry & marina, is a great set of stairs and slides the kids can play and burn off their energy.

Follow the trail around towards the waterfront and ascend all three of the sail mounds, climb the tall rock structures with stairs to the peak for phenomenal views. You'll enjoy art pieces throughout the park. Outdoor concerts are held in the summer here too.

Once you've explored this area, head over to Pt Ruston where there is a park and spray ground along the waterfront. Get yourself some grub for a picnic and don't miss the ice cream from Social Ice Cream. A local favorite!

42. VISIT OUTER SPACE

Head to outer space at the **Pierce** College Science Dome. Visit the 58-seat planetarium with a 38-foot dome arching over the entire theater. You will immerse yourself amongst the stars and learn about anything from space junk to the Northern Lights to ancient Egypt. (9401 Farwest Dr SW, Lakewood, Wa)

has so much to offer! Just south of Seabeck, Wa., it is a secluded cove on Hood Canal with views of the Olympics. You will first hike through deep forest trails until you get to an estuary. The highlight is finding the old Stump House made from a hollowed out cedar. (2.5 miles round trip, 360' elevation, No Dogs Allowed, 50 min from Gig Harbor)

Green Mountain: Gold Creek Trail provides some spectacular views, if you're up for the climb. From one viewpoint, you get to look west towards the Olympic Mountains and up the Hood Canal. The other major viewpoint, you can see Seattle & the Cascades.

Bonus! You will also encounter a waterfall about 1/4 mile into the hike. (Pet friendly, Discover Pass required)

Road Closures: Always check access status before you head out to explore.

94. DIP YOUR TOES IN THE **PACIFIC OCEAN**

The Olympic Peninsula is home to a scenic stretch of the Pacific Coast Scenic Byway, or WA-101. Visitors flock to this beloved route to experience diverse terrain, including glacial mountains, rugged coastlines, ancient forests, and a saltwater fjord. Wildlife abounds, and charming seaside towns offer rest and exploration. You can drive the entire route or explore it in parts, with plenty of attractions and opportunities for a multi-day road trip.

If you're looking for a relaxing weekend at the beach stop in at Ocean Shores. It is known for its long sandy beaches and nearby water canals that are fun to explore.

Some other places to stop along the Pacific Coast are Seabrook. Quinault & Long Beach.

95. NAVIGATE A SPIT

Dungeness Spit is the longest natural sandspit in the US. Hike along this beautiful 5-mile sandy stretch to reach the historic lighthouse. It's part of the **Dungeness National Wildlife** Refuge, where you can spot seals, sea lions, seabirds, ducks,

and maybe even whales. Remember to check the tides to avoid getting stranded at high tide.



96. VISIT SOMEWHERE **OUAINT**

Poulsbo is sure to steal your heart. Also known as "Little Norway," this quaint town has a slower pace and is the perfect place to go to exhale. Sluy's Poulsbo Bakery is a popular spot to stop at, then grab a Cup-of-Joe at one of the coffee shops and take a stroll along the waterfront & marina. The downtown corridor is lined with boutique shops and art galleries. You can also rent kayaks and go watch the sea lions. (45minute drive from Gig Harbor)

97. SEABECK - BIG BEEF

Experience a relaxed atmosphere with scenic drives and notable stops as you head out to Seabeck, Wa. A 40-minute drive from Gig Harbor, you will find a public pier, and a spacious beach with a kayak launch. Don't miss Scenic Beach State Park, offering campsites and breathtaking views of the Olympic Mountains along the Hood Canal.

In June, make a detour to Big Beef Harbor Estuary during low tide, to witness bald eagles and herons feeding on exposed fish, but be aware of the crowded bird-watching scene and avoid the oyster beds.

98. DISAPPOINTMENT

Head to the lower southwest corner of the state to enjoy Cape **Disappointment State Park.** From the lighthouses to the beaches, it does NOT disappoint. (3-hour drive)



99. WALK TO THE EDGE

Venture out to the northwesternmost point of the contiguous United States at Cape Flattery where the Strait of Juan de Fuca joins the Pacific Ocean. The trail takes you through the forest and out to rugged sea stacks jutting out of the ocean. You could get a glimpse of seals or even orcas.

On your way to or from Cape Flattery, make some time to stop in at Salt Creek Recreation Area. This place is a picture-perfect blend of lush forest, rocky bluffs, sandy beaches, and some of the most amazing tide pools to explore. Previously a former defense military base during World War II (Camp Hayden), it is now a scenic camp site.

100. IF YOU HAVE MORE THAN JUST A DAY

Go visit the San Juan Islands. They offer rustic PNW landscapes and abundant wildlife.

Orcas Island showcases Moran State Park's ancient forest and Mt. Constitution, while

San Juan Island features the lively town of Friday Harbor and Lime Kiln Point State Park, a prime orca-whale lookout.

101. VISIT ROYALTY

Victoria, the capital of British Columbia, rests on Vancouver Island's southern tip. Outdoor activities thrive amidst its ample parkland. The city's Victorian architecture, like the impressive

Craigdarroch Castle, reflects its British colonial heritage. Among its many formal gardens, Butchart Gardens VICTORIA BC

With its lush forests, cascading rivers, and majestic mountains, the Evergreen State is home to an abundance of stunning waterfalls, each offering a unique and memorable experience for hikers of all ages. While there are countless waterfalls scattered throughout Washington, here are just a few recommendations to add to your bucket list. So lace up your hiking boots, pack your camera, and get ready to explore the natural wonders of Washington's spectacular waterfalls.

1. TUMWATER FALLS LOOP

Offers a picturesque stroll through Olympia's Tumwater Falls Park. This easy 1-mile hike is ideal for families and furry friends alike, with no pass required for entry.

Follow the gentle trail as it meanders along the Deschutes River, leading you to the breathtaking sight of tumbling waterfalls.



2. STAIRCASE RAPIDS LOOP

Venture further into the wilderness with a trip to Lake Cushman in Olympic National Park to explore the Staircase Rapids Loop. This 2-mile hike is perfect for those seeking a bit more adventure, with stunning views of the rushing rapids and towering trees. While pets are not allowed on this trail, it's an excellent option for families with children, offering a moderate challenge with a rewarding payoff.

3. HAMMA HAMMA FALLS

For a waterfall adventure accessible by road, head to Lilliwaup in Olympic National Forest to discover the beauty of Hamma Hamma Falls. This two-tiered waterfall spans 80 feet and can be enjoyed by hikers of all skill levels. Bring a picnic lunch and spend the day exploring the

4. MURHUT FALLS

Immerse yourself in the tranquility of the Duckabush River Valley with a hike to Murhut Falls in Olympic National Forest. This 1.6-mile round-trip trail leads you through old-growth forests to a stunning 130-foot waterfall, where you can bask in the beauty of nature's grandeur. With no pass required for entry and a gentle, well-built trail, Murhut Falls is the perfect destination for a family-friendly outing.

5. ROCKY BROOK FALLS

Escape to Brinnon for a visit to Rocky Brook Falls, where a short, quarter-mile hike leads you to a breathtaking horsetail waterfall plunging 200 feet into a tranguil pool below. This private destination is open to the public and welcomes visitors of all ages, making it an ideal spot for a refreshing swim on a hot summer day.

6. DICKERSON CREEK FALLS

Located at Ueland Tree Farm in Bremerton, Dickerson Creek Waterfall offers a convenient escape into nature with its serene beauty and easy accessibility. This popular trail offers multiple paths, there are some steep inclines and muddy areas.

7. LITTLE MASHEL FALLS IN **EATONVILLE**

Little Mashel Falls in Eatonville (5 miles round trip, Moderate) offers three waterfalls with multiple viewing areas after a moderate 5 mile round trip hike. The best part is you can walk behind/underneath one of them! The tallest waterfall plunges over 90 feet!

8. TWIN FALLS, SNOQUALMIE **PASS**

Twin Falls in Snoqualmie Pass is a moderate 2.4 miles round trip hike with another trio of waterfalls just off I-90. The first one is a short trail from the parking lot which makes this really family friendly.



9. WALLACE FALLS, NORTH **CASCADES**

Wallace Falls, North Cascades hike has breathtaking views of the Wallace River and the surrounding falls on this popular trail. Relatively low difficulty, it is 5.6 miles round trip hike showcasing the diversity and beauty that the Central Cascades have to offer.

10. BOULDER RIVER, NORTH CASCADES

Boulder River, North Cascades is a nice year round hike. This is a relatively easy, popular hike (8.6 miles round trip) off the Mountain Loop
Highway is a great picnic spot!

11. MARYMERE FALLS, OLYMPIC PENINSULA

Near the shores of Lake Crescent you will take an easy/moderate hike 1.8 round trip through old-growth, moss-laden forest and have 2 viewpoint options which are both fantastic at Marymere Falls in the Olympic Peninsula.

12. BRIDAL VEIL FALLS, NORTH CASCADES

Bridal Veil Falls is a 4 mile round trip moderate hike in the North Cascades. The waterfall flows out of Lake Serene.
There are steps paralleling the falls to help you enjoy this nature show!

13. CARTER FALLS, MOUNT RAINIER NATIONAL PARK

Carter Falls in Mount Rainier

is family-friendly and has
amazing mountain, forest
and river views including the 53foot drop waterfall.


14. MYRTLE FALLS, MOUNT RAINIER NATIONAL PARK

Franklin Falls is a great easy hike in Snoqualmie Pass. Just 2 miles round trip and waterfall reward at the end! Kids will like this one!








