

Beverly Hills Prince mansion became a purple hit market for \$ 30 million and has a rooftop tennis court

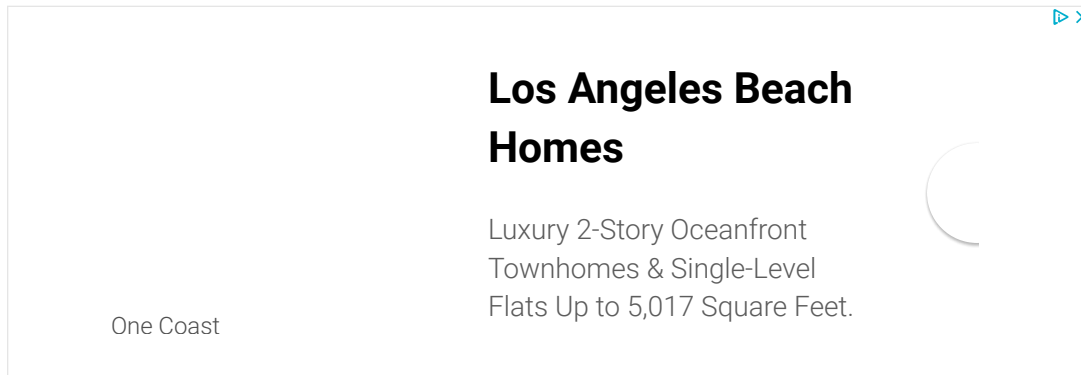


The Beverly Hills mansion that turned Prince purple hits the market for \$ 30 million, with ten bedrooms, a rooftop tennis court, and a cave with slide

- 1235 Sierra Alta Way in Beverly Hills, California was purchased in 2004 by Utah Jazz player Carlos Boozer
- He leased the 18,000-square-foot estate on 2.15 acres of land to Prince and was enraged when the musician turned it into a purple palace, but they became friends after returning it to its usual appearance
- Elizabeth Taylor, film producer Ted Fields and Rockstar Energy founder Russ Weiner have also lived there
- The property is for sale for \$ 30 million or the main house can be rented for \$ 80,000 a month
- It has 10 beds, 13 bathrooms, a ballroom, a wine room, a tennis court, a gym / indoor sports field, a garage for 4 cars and a swimming pool with a swim-up bar and a cave.

- The sale comes with a second 3 bed English Tudor home on Sierra Alta Way 1255, covering 3,300 square feet with 20 ft ceilings, gourmet kitchen, bar and billiard rooms, den, pool, spa and 2 car garage

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An 18,000-square-foot estate, where Prince once lived, has entered the market for \$ 30 million, and the property comes with two houses plus two vacant lots totaling 2.15 acres of land.

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Purchased by Utah Jazz player Carlos Boozer in 2004, the late musician hired 1255 Sierra Alta Way in Beverly Hills, California, while the basketball star was away for the NBA season and transformed into a purple palace.

Boozer was said to be furious when he saw his 10 beds, a 13-bath tub, a rooftop tennis court, and a swim-up bar with altered slide. But the pair became friends when Prince wired him \$ 500,000 and pledged to remove the furniture and decor after his \$ 95,000-a-month lease ended.

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It has a rooftop tennis court with views of Los Angeles, California



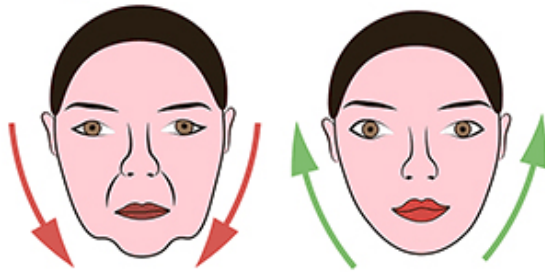
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The property has a pool bar and a cave with slide. It was built in 1953 by Hal Braxton Hayes for topless tanning

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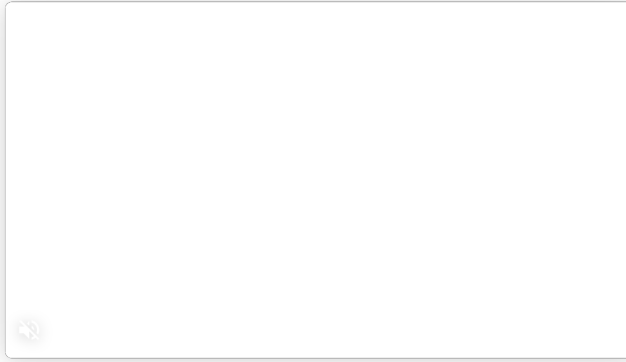


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When Prince – who died in April 2016 – lived in the mansion, the two-story gym became a disco with DJ booth

The main house – which can be rented for \$ 80,000 a month – is 15,101 m2 in size and comes with a rooftop tennis court with sweeping views of Los Angeles. A second floor loft with large windows also overlooks the city.

Images from the Oppenheim Group – the subject of Netflix reality show Selling Sunset – show a ballroom, wine room, solarium, column-lined living room, and 4-car garage.



When Prince – who died in April 2016 – lived in the mansion, the weight room in Boozer’s two-story gym became a disco with a DJ booth, and some bedrooms became a hair salon and massage parlor.





Those who lease will only have access to the main house and not to the additional house and two empty plots on the 2.15 hectare site



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It is located near the famous Sunset Strip and offers plenty of privacy thanks to its design and extensive land



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Prince replaced the golden lions on the 12 meter high gates of the then owner Carlos Boozer and hung his 'artist, formerly known as' symbol

He moved a heart-shaped bed and removed the Italian carpets in favor of purple and black carpets.

Prince hosted many parties and concerts at the property near Sunset Strip, replacing golden lions at Boozer's 12-meter gates, so guests were greeted by his purple 'artist, formerly known as' symbol.

The one who buys the estate will also get the property of Sierra Alta Way 1255, a 3 bedroom, 3300 square foot English Tudor with 20 ft ceilings, gourmet kitchen, bar and billiard rooms, den, pool, spa and Garage for 2 cars. But the lease only provides access to the main house.

Since it was built in 1953 by Hal Braxton Hayes, who built it for topless tanning and to include an artificial beach, the mansion has been inhabited over the years by actress Elizabeth Taylor, film producer Ted Fields and Rockstar Energy founder Russ Weiner.
