


























## Super Simple Mulled Apple Cider

#### **4 INGREDIENTS**

- Apple cider (fresh, unfiltered is best) · 1 orange (sliced)
- 2-3 cinnamon sticks
   Whole cloves (about 1 tablespoon)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Press the cloves into orange slices, add everything to a pot with the cider, bring to a boil, then simmer on low for 30-60 minutes. Remove the spices when it tastes perfect to you, and serve hot!

Optional add: A little brown sugar or maple syrup if you want it sweeter.

Optional "spiked" instructions: After simmering for 30-60 minutes, add in your choice of rum, brandy, or bourbon, and let it simmer for another 10 minutes.



## From-Scratch Spiced Tea

#### 4 INGREDIENTS

· 4 cups water

- Fresh orange juice (1-2 oranges)
- Black tea bags (or loose black tea)
- Fresh lemon juice (from 1 lemon)


• 1/2 cup sugar

Whole cloves and 1 cinnamon stick

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Steep the tea in boiling water, then in a separate pan boil water with sugar and spices for one minute, remove the spices, add the citrus juices, and combine with the tea. Serve warm!





## HOLIDAY HERB-CRUSTED BEEF TENDERLOIN

Celebrate the holidays with a showstopping Herb-Crusted Beef Tenderloin that's juicy, flavorful, and sure to wow your guests. This elegant yet simple recipe delivers a fragrant herb crust and a rich red wine sauce, perfect for Christmas, New Year's, or any festive gathering.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- · 3 lb beef tenderloin, trimmed and tied
- · 2 tbsp olive oil
- · 2 tsp kosher salt
- · 1 tsp freshly ground black pepper
- · 3 aarlic cloves, minced
- · 2 tbsp fresh rosemary, finely chopped
- · 2 tbsp fresh thyme, finely chopped
- · 1tbsp Dijon mustard
- · 1 cup dry red wine
- · 2 tbsp unsalted butter

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Prep the Tenderloin: Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C). Pat tenderloin dry with paper towels. Rub with 1 tablespoon olive oil, then season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Make the Herb Crust: Mix garlic, rosemary, thyme, and Dijon mustard into a paste. Rub evenly over the tenderloin.
- 3. Sear for Flavor: Heat remaining 1 tablespoon olive oil in a large ovensafe skillet over medium-high heat. Sear tenderloin 2-3 minutes per side until golden-brown.

- 4. Roast to Perfection: Transfer skillet to oven. Roast 25-30 minutes or until internal temperature reaches 135°F (57°C) for medium-rare, using a meat thermometer.
- 5. Rest and Deglaze: Remove tenderloin, tent with foil, and rest 10 minutes. In the skillet, add red wine over medium heat, scrape up browned bits, and reduce by half. Stir in butter for a glossy sauce.
- 6. Serve: Slice tenderloin into ½-inch pieces, drizzle with sauce, and garnish with herbs. Pair with roasted vegetables or mashed potatoes.

Why It's Perfect for the Holidays: This tenderloin balances rich flavors with easy prep, freeing you to enjoy the festivities. The herb crust adds aromatic flair, and the red wine sauce brings restaurant-quality elegance. It pairs beautifully with bold holiday wines, making it a crowd-pleaser.

#### TIPS

- · Prepare the herb rub a day ahead and refrigerate.
- Let tenderloin sit at room temperature for 30 minutes before cooking for even roasting.
- · If the tenderloin has a significantly thinner portion, remove it and reserve for other recipes (like stir-fry or skewers) to avoid uneven cooking.



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- Marshmallows

- Cornflakes

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

#### Step 1:

#### Make the marshmallow sauce

Pour the marshmallows and butter into a large, microwave-safe bowl. Microwave them uncovered for about 45 seconds or until the butter is melted and the marshmallows are puffed. Tint the mixture with green food coloring. Start slow and make as green as you desire.

#### Step 2:

#### Add the cereal

Pour the cornflakes into the bowl and stir them into the marshmallow mixture. The cereal should be completely coated. Spray the waxed paper with nonstick spray so the wreaths don't stick to the paper.

#### Step 3:

#### Shape the cookies

Butter your hands and divide the cereal mixture into eight portions. Work quickly to firmly press each portion into a 3-inch wreath. Place the wreaths on the lined baking sheet.

#### Step 4:

#### Add the candies

While the wreaths are still wet, add three red mini M&M's in a cluster on each one to look like a small bunch of holly berries. Let the wreaths rest until they're set and easy to move. Then they're ready to eat!

#### How to Store Christmas Wreath Cookies

These marshmallow treat wreaths quickly become dry and hard if they're left out. To protect them, place the wreaths in a tightly sealed storage container at room temperature as soon as they're cool. They'll last for about three days.








