Redstone Lake & Little Redstone Lake: Your Haliburton Cottage Guide

Redstone Lake and Little Redstone Lake, nestled in the picturesque Haliburton Highlands of Central Ontario, are highly sought-after destinations for cottage buyers. These pristine lakes are part of the larger Gull River system, flowing into Lake Ontario via the Trent-Severn Waterway, and are managed for water flow control. Redstone Lake

- Size & Depth: Redstone Lake is a substantial body of water, spanning approximately 1,190 hectares (2,941 acres) with a perimeter of 38.20 km (23.74 miles). It's the third-largest lake in Haliburton. Its impressive depth reaches a maximum of 83 meters (272 feet) with an average depth of 21.90 meters (72 feet), making it a deep, clear, and cold-water Canadian Shield lake.
- Connectivity: Redstone is a key component of a four-lake system that includes Little Redstone Lake, Pelaw Lake, and Lower Pelaw Lake. A short channel connects it to Little Redstone, from where boaters can explore the Pelaw Lakes via the Pelaw River.
- Characteristics: The lake is renowned for its stunning scenery, featuring a diverse shoreline with both shallow sandy areas and deep rocky points, numerous bays, dramatic cliffs, and picturesque islands. Its position near the headwaters of the Trent System ensures exceptionally clean water.
- Activities: A paradise for water enthusiasts, Redstone Lake is perfect for kayaking, canoeing, water skiing, wakeboarding, and tubing. The surrounding lush forests offer ample opportunities for hiking and nature observation, appealing to those seeking a peaceful retreat.
- **Fishing:** Anglers will appreciate the excellent fishing, with common catches including Lake Trout (including the unique "Haliburton Gold" variety), Smallmouth Bass, Largemouth Bass, Yellow Perch, and Rock Bass.
- Accessibility: Public boat launch access is available, ensuring convenience for residents and visitors.
- **Community:** The Redstone Lake Cottagers Association represents the interests of residents and cottagers, fostering a strong community spirit.

Little Redstone Lake

- Location & Connectivity: Situated west of Kennisis Lake in Haliburton County, Little Redstone Lake is directly linked to Redstone Lake via a connecting channel. Pelaw Creek flows into Little Redstone from the southeast, with water subsequently flowing into Redstone Lake.
- Depth: Little Redstone Lake reaches an approximate maximum depth of 192 feet.
- **Fishing:** Similar to its larger counterpart, Little Redstone Lake offers fantastic fishing. Major fish species include Lake Trout, Smallmouth Bass, Yellow Perch, Musky (Muskellunge), Northern Pike, Walleye, and various Panfish.
- Accessibility: A convenient boat launch is located at the bridge crossing Pelaw Creek on the lake's southeast side.

While offering a sense of seclusion with lower cottage density, they remain conveniently located within a 20-30 minute drive to the towns of West Guilford and Haliburton for essential services, shops, and restaurants, and are also close to the Haliburton Forest and Wildlife Reserve for year-round outdoor adventures including hiking, biking, and winter sports. Generally a 2-3 hour drive from the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), these lakes present an ideal opportunity for a tranquil yet accessible cottage lifestyle.
