The Downtown Neighbourhood

New high-rise condos bunched up against heritage conversions, loft spaces & micro suites, and hidden flats above low-rise storefronts. All done with a certain local flair that makes our Downtown feel just the right size of urban. Local boutique shopping is the norm here, in the Design District around Herald St, Mosaic Village on Upper Fort St, and the intimate Lower Johnson (LoJo) boutiques. Bike or walk, you're always near the waterfront as well as neighbouring urban villages.



Who Lives Here?

Professionals and some smaller families wanting to rent or own in the urban heart of the city, with easy access to the waterfront and all areas of Greater Victoria.

Recent years have brought us new buildings like The Era, Sovereign, 834 Johnson, The Oriental, Mondrian, Hudson, Union – with the Escher and Janion projects undergoing development now. With developers and the City working to revitalize historic buildings and walkability along the waterfront, coupled with the construction of the new Johnson St. Bridge, Downtown is currently enjoying some important rejuvenation.

JAMES BAY

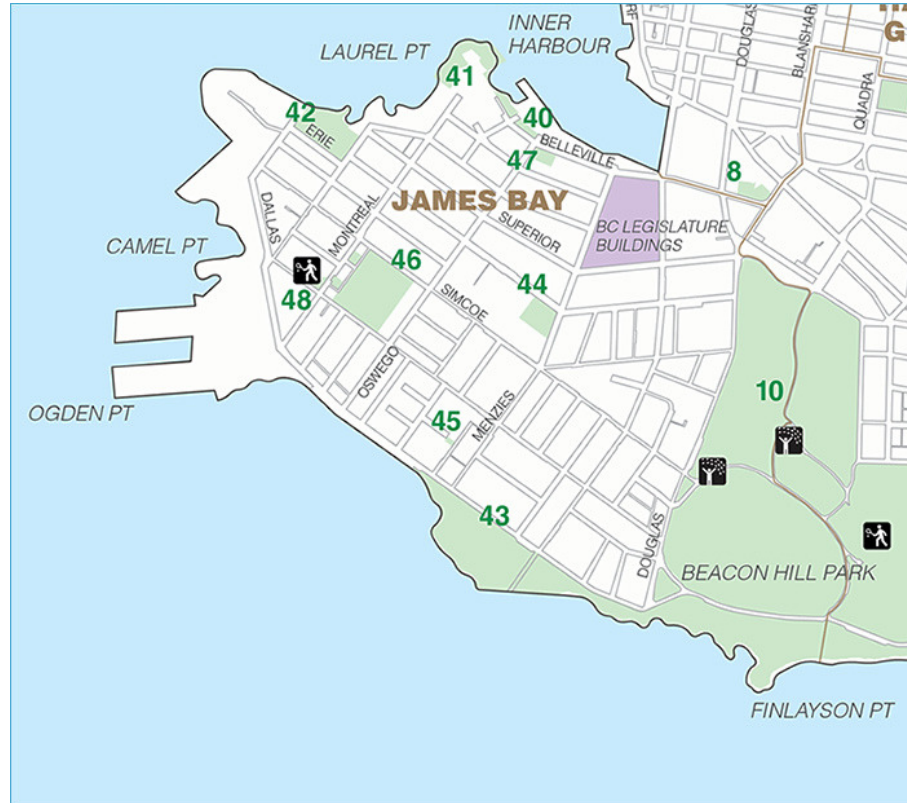
The James Bay Neighbourhood

James Bay is Victoria's second largest neighborhood in both size and population. When people think of James Bay the word diverse comes to mind. Luxury condos mixed in with older townhomes, 100-year old single-family homes, new strata duplexes and conversions with blocks and blocks of character.

Who Lives Here?

A mix of long term residents, retirees, with young families, artists and students. Set just behind the Legislature Buildings and the Inner Harbour, James Bay is an area where both locals and tourists can marvel at some stunning turn-of-the-century architecture.

Brownstone walkups line some of the perimeter near Fisherman's Wharf, with condo buildings like The Reef and Shoal Point close to the water's edge. The James Bay Village anchors the neighbourhood at Simcoe and Menzies St while a few blocks away the cruise ships pull in by the breakwater at Ogden Point. Space is at a premium so the lots and backyards tend to be a bit smaller, although it is hard to notice when you are surrounded by ocean walkways and the vast greenery of Beacon Hill Park. The uniqueness of James Bay can be felt just by wandering around on a weekend afternoon.



James Bay Schools

James Bay Shopping

For farm fresh organic greens and handmade arts and crafts, check out the vibrant James Bay Market at the corner of Menzies and Superior. It's part farmer's market, part flea market featuring work by local crafters.

The hub of the neighbourhood is James Bay Village, with a liquor store, pharmacy, coffee shops, cafes, bakeries, Thrifty Foods grocery store, banks, credit unions (which you should join instead of a bank) and other interesting businesses such as The Bent Mast, a unique pub in a historic Victorian building.



For a unique experience head down to the famous Fisherman's Wharf, where amongst the houseboats you'll find a wide variety of seafood vendors. And possibly, one of these days... pirates.



FAIRFIELD

Equally hip and historic, this is one of the hottest neighborhoods in Victoria. Don't forget to leave your car parked as you're within walking distance to everything. You can walk endless blocks with stunning 100-year old homes, newer character conversions and townhouse. You are within walking or biking distance to all amenities!

Fairfield is just under 2.2 km from downtown Victoria, a short 7 minute dash.

As a social hub, you'll find locals meeting in the cafes, pubs and restaurants of Cook St Village. There are plenty of runners and walkers taking their dogs for walks along the beautiful oceanfront at Dallas Road!



From Fairfield, the BC Ferries Swartz Bay Terminal is 33km away.

If traveling by float plane is your style, the docks of the inner harbour waiting to board for a scenic flight across the Strait of Georgia.



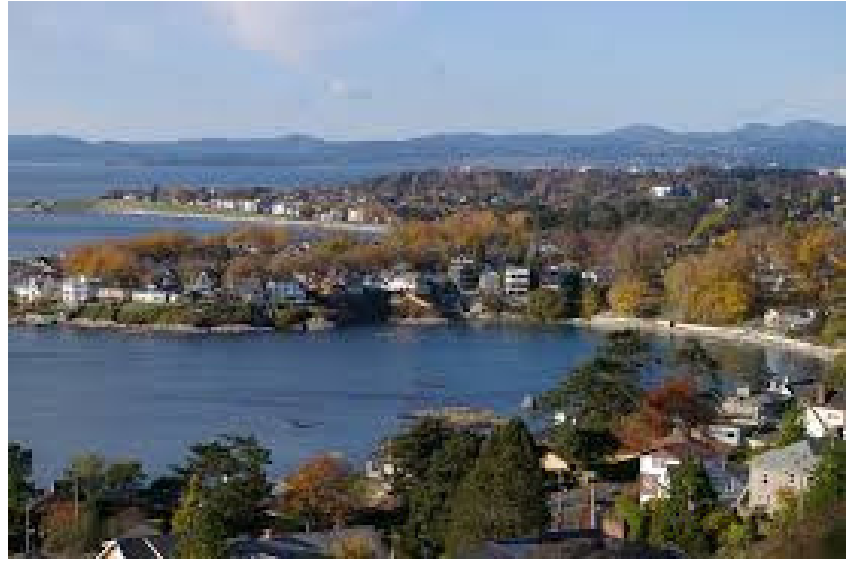

The Fairfield **Neighbourhood**

This laid-back residential neighbourhood also features highly regarded elementary schools, plus the ever-popular Beacon Hill Park. As may be expected, there is also constant, high demand from buyers.



Who Lives Here?

Fairfield is the largest neighbourhood in Victoria in size and population.

It is approximately 271 hectares (669 acres). Located in the south central portion of the City, the population was approximately 11,650 in 2011 which is 15% of the total population. Fairfield is almost entirely residential, with single family homes in the south and condominium buildings in the northwest.

There are also some institutional uses such as St. Ann's Academy, the Cook St Village Seniors Activity Centre near Beacon Hill Park, and Fairfield Community Place near Robert Porter Park.

For residents of the Fairfield neighborhood, the Cook Street Village is a hub of amenities. Providing the area with grocery stores, coffee shops, a local butcher, charming boutiques and the requisite British-inspired pub. Cook Street Village is the kind of place where you can run all of your errands, know your butcher by name ("Meat Dawg," by the way) grab a burger or beer for lunch, and bump into half a dozen people you know.

Just a few blocks away, at Five Points, is one of the best farmer's markets in the city, the Moss St Market on Saturdays!



FERNWOOD

The Fernwood Neighbourhood

Being one of the hippest neighbourhoods in the city there is no wonder young urban families run to its stock of older homes with hammer and drill in hand. Wide streets, parks galore and friendly folk transforming the area block by block — you can see and feel the community spirit in the painted lamp posts and boulevard gardens.



Who Lives Here?

A mix of long term residents, retirees, with young families, artists and students. You can satisfy your craving for local flavour with the Belfry Theatre, the classic Fernwood Inn, small restaurants, cafes and boutiques, which are all crammed into a handful of blocks in the Fernwood Village. The neighbourhood is also home to Victoria High School, known as Vic High, the oldest public high school west of Winnipeg and north of San Francisco.

In Fernwood you can still find ugly duckling properties that can be transformed into swans with a little sweat equity. The price point for older, smaller homes can be very appealing for young buyers. Its short walking or biking distance to Downtown and other great parts of the city makes this area very attractive.

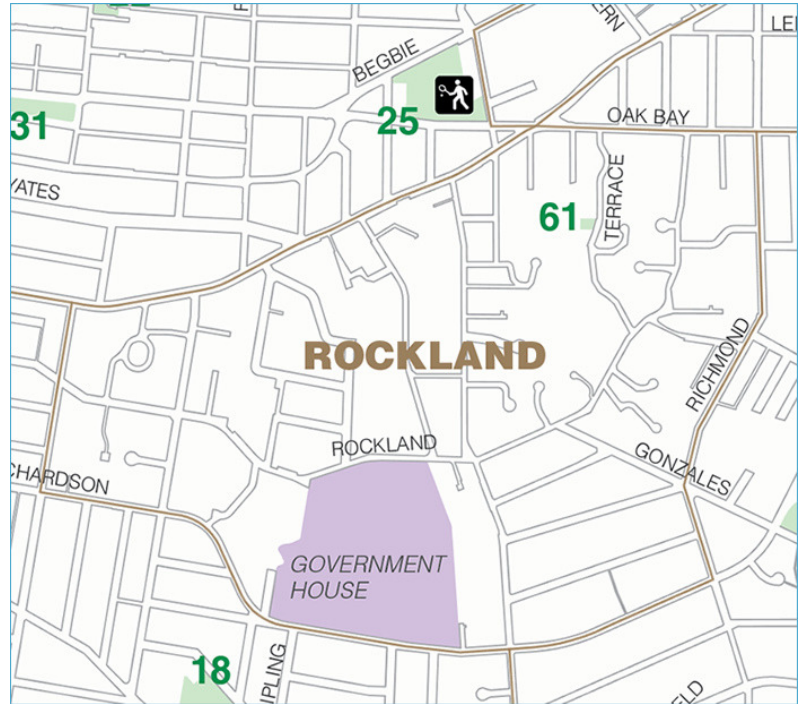

The Rockland Neighbourhood

Who Lives Here?

Many of the original homes were designed by well-known architects such as Samuel Maclure and were commissioned by wealthy bankers and entrepreneurs of the day. It is also the home of Craigdarroch Castle, Government House and the Victoria Art Gallery.

This historic neighbourhood is located just east of Downtown and is walkable to Fairfield, Cook St Village and the ocean. It's worth the stroll through Rockland's winding streets on a sunny afternoon.

WHAT YOU'LL LOVE

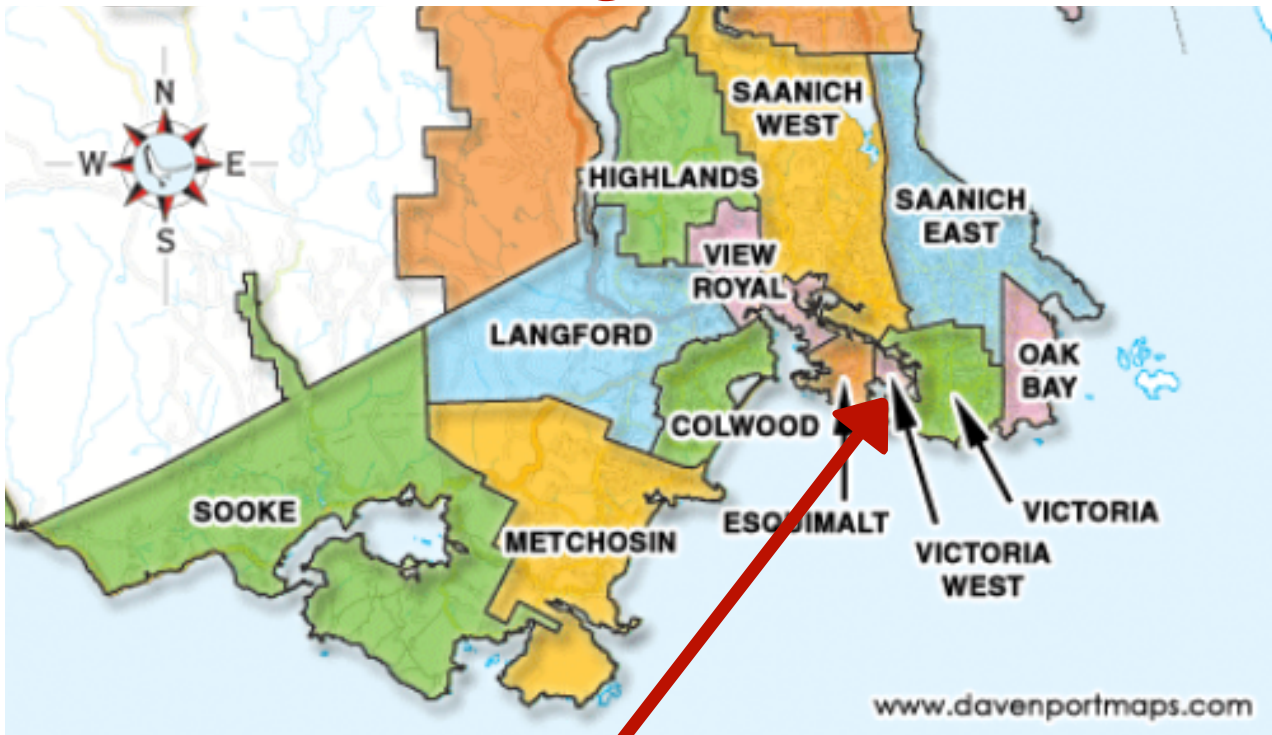
The ability to bike or stroll into Downtown, or jog along the Galloping Goose Trail. Offering a beautiful walkway on the other side of the harbour.

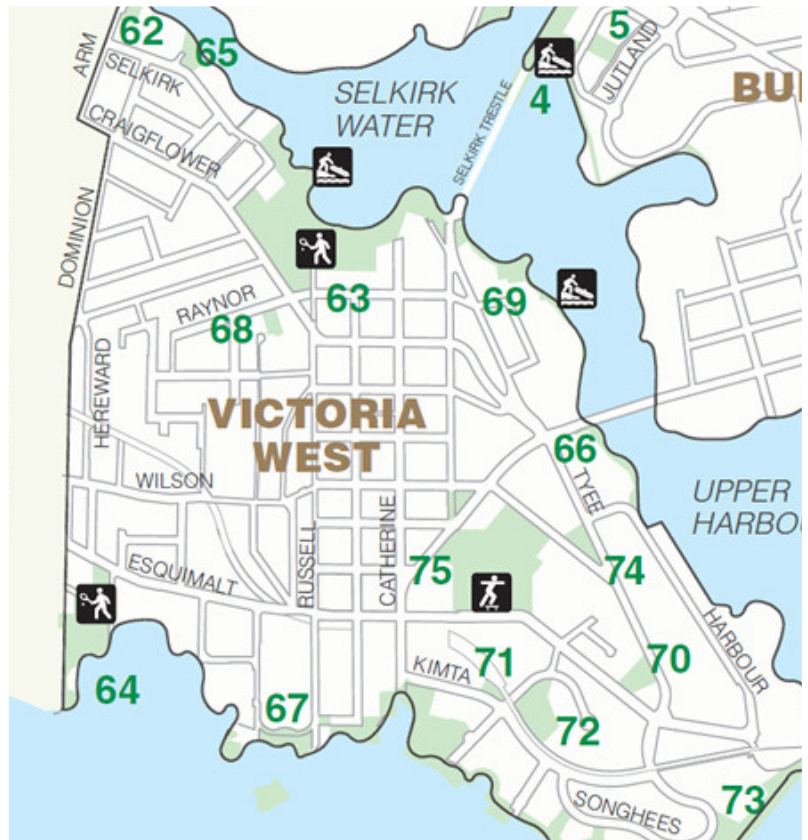

The Songhees/Vic West Neighbourhood

Just over the bridge from Downtown, new condo towers like Bayview and Promontory are changing the skyline in the Vic West/Songhees neighbourhood. This area also includes affordable townhomes and condos at the well-planned Railyards development, all pleasantly skirted by waterfront walkways and green space.

Westside Village is the hub for commercial activity with grocery shopping, cafes, offices, clinics and a fitness centre. Plus the popular Galloping Goose Trail is used in all seasons by cyclists and runners heading in or out of town.



Who Lives Here?

There's also a hidden cluster of turn-of-the-century homes tucked just behind the newer condos in Vic West. This is a more established residential area consisting primarily of older, detached homes. There's a nice little village with a few local shops, and it's easy to see why young urban families have been moving in and renovating the heritage homes here.

Songhees/Vic West **Shopping**

Westside Village is home to Save-On Foods, while the trendy shops of "Lo-Jo" lie just a short walk over the Johnson Street Bridge. Uptown Shopping Centre is also close by, either by bicycle on the Galloping Goose regional trail, or by car and by bus.

Songhees/Vic West lies within walk and bicycling distance of downtown Victoria. The Old Island Highway also travels through the neighborhood and provides an alternative route out to recreation and shopping opportunities in the Westshore.



One of Canada's pioneering craft breweries, Spinnakers Gastro pub is also located in Vic West. It's a great place to enjoy fine food, delicious beer and fantastic views.
