The Herman Leroy Emmet House, c.1911.

Commissioned in 1910 by H. Leroy Emmet, Glen Malcain—"the ever-delightful glen"—was masterfully designed by the prominent architect H. Van Buren Magonigle as an English Country manor of rare distinction. Set on nearly five and a half acres with an extraordinary 1,000 feet of private lakefront, the estate commands panoramic views across the full sweep of Tuxedo Lake to the Ramapo Mountains beyond, all within a historic 2,300-acre gated enclave. Approached through a massive Renaissance door of iron and hand-forged bolts, the 10,000-square-foot residence reveals a procession of remarkable interiors, from



a columned reception hall adorned with Corinthian capitals and sculpted friezes to a bog oak-paneled dining room set within a pentagonal bay of glass overlooking the water. Throughout the home, craftsmanship and scale speak to a refined architectural vision: a grand living room distinguished by rare Thomas Chippendale Chinoiserie doors, an elegant library, and a marble-floored conservatory bathed in light. Private accommodations—five to six principal bedrooms

with extensive staff quarters—are reached by a magnificent two-story elliptical staircase crowned with intricately carved woodwork. From the glass-enclosed solarium to the circular, twelve-sided sitting room adjoining the primary suite above, nearly every room is oriented to capture sweeping, world-class vistas of lake and mountain, making Glen Malcain as much a celebration of landscape as of architecture.
