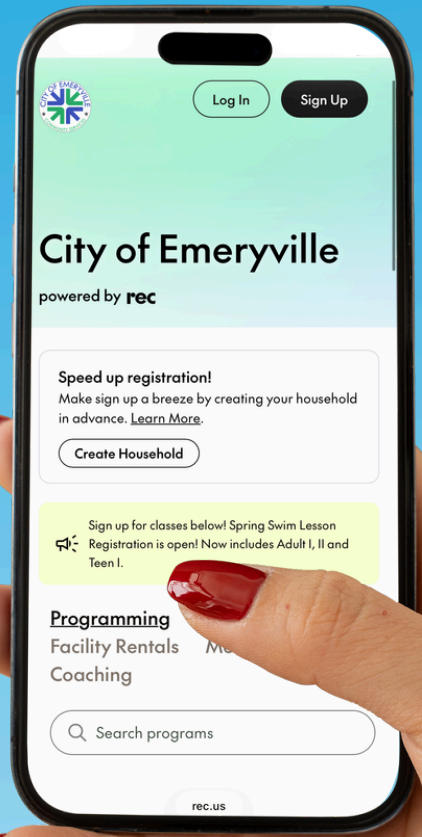
After all, community is not just where we live, it's how we live together. Here's to a summer filled with connection, joy, and possibility.

SWIM LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS

Make a splash with Emeryville Swim Lessons! Our trained instructors offer fun, safe classes for all ages—focusing on water safety, skill-building, and swimmer progress.

Parent-Child: Turtle Tots

Water adjustment and safety skills for parent and child. This class is not designed to teach toddlers to swim independently, but to increase the comfort level of children in and around water.

Ages: 6 months - 3 yrs

Preschool: Starfish

The primary goal is to build water confidence and basic swimming skills through engaging activities, games, and interactive exercises. Instructors use age-appropriate teaching methods, incorporating play-based learning to make the lessons enjoyable for the little ones.

Ages: 3 - 5 yrs

Level 1: Otter

This beginner level focuses on water introduction and basic skills. Participants develop water entry and exit techniques, front and back float with support, and learn to glide through the water. Water safety rules and basic pool behavior are introduced.

Ages: 6 - 11 yrs

Level 2: Jellyfish

Participants in Level 2 work on fundamental aquatic skills. This includes floating without support, retrieving submerged objects, and exploring underwater. Basic front and back crawl arm movements are introduced, laying the foundation for future strokes.

Ages: 6 - 11 yrs

Level 3: Seahorse

In Level 3, participants begin stroke development. They refine front and back crawl, learn breaststroke and elementary backstroke, and practice treading water. Water safety principles, such as recognizing lifeguards and using life jackets, are emphasized.

Ages: 6 - 11 yrs

Level 4: Dolphin

Level 4 focuses on stroke improvement. Participants refine their strokes, including front and back crawl, breaststroke, and elementary backstroke. Sidestroke and butterfly are introduced. Treading water duration is extended, and participants learn basic water rescue techniques.

Ages: 6 - 11 yrs

Level 5: Stingray

Level 5 emphasizes refinement of skills, building advanced endurance, and preparing for more specialized swim training. Child must swim front crawl, back crawl and elementary backstroke for 15 yards independently in water that may be over their head. They will refine front crawl with rotary breathing, back crawl, and elementary backstroke.

Ages: 7 - 13 yrs

Level 6: Orca

Level 6 focuses on mastering advanced techniques, increasing swimming proficiency, and preparing for competitive swimming or specialized aquatic activities. Child must be able swim at least 25 yards of front crawl, back crawl, elementary backstroke, and breaststroke in deep water. They will also practice treading water with different kicks and flip turns.

Ages: 7 - 13 yrs

Private

Private swim lesson is a personalized swimming instruction session conducted one-on-one between a swim instructor and an individual student. Private swim lessons provide an opportunity for accelerated learning, immediate feedback, and customized skill development based on the student's abilities and progression.

Ages: 3+

Teen I



Designed for teens new to swimming or building confidence in the water. This class focuses on foundational skills including breath control, floating, kicking, and basic stroke introduction in a supportive, encouraging environment.

Ages: 13 - 17 yrs

Senior Citizens Emery GoRound Property & Business Improvement District (PBID) Rebate

On February 2, 2016, the Emeryville City Council adopted Resolution No. 16-08 to establish a Property and Business Improvement District (PBID) Senior Rebate Program. If you are 65 or older, own your home and pay an assessment on your property for the Emery Go Round PBID, you may apply for a Senior Rebate that could mean savings for you.

How Do I Apply And Receive A Rebate?

Where can I get an application?

The application is available through the City of Emeryville Senior PBID Rebate Program:

Applications are mailed out to those who have filed in past years by the end of March each year.

When can I apply?

To expedite receiving your rebate, we would appreciate submission of the application by May 1. Each fiscal year (July-June) the City will send an application to prior applicants at the end of March.

New applicants can also submit their applications according to the timeline shown above.

STRATEGIC PLAN



On March 21, 2025, the City Council held its first Strategic Planning Session with the City Manager and Executive Team. During this session, the Council established four multi-year goals to guide staffing, budgeting, and City initiatives, thereby setting priorities. The goals are as follows:

1. **Livable, Safe, and Vibrant Community**
2. **Quality Infrastructure and Environmental Stewardship**
3. **Dynamic and Growing Businesses**
4. **Resilient Organization and Employer of Choice**

Additionally, the Council identified four top priorities:

1. **Bicycle and pedestrian-focused projects (e.g., 40th Street redesign and Ashby interchange)**
2. **A new website for public use containing information about City services**
3. **Revenue, budget, and audits, including researching revenue measures for 2026**
4. **Sutter Health Development**

Each goal is framed as a desired outcome, providing the foundation for City services, programs, and capital projects. Throughout the year, the City advanced housing initiatives, completed key infrastructure improvements, supported local businesses, and strengthened organizational effectiveness. These efforts reflect the City's ongoing commitment to delivering high-quality services, investing in long-term sustainability, and fostering a thriving community.

On February 20, 2026, the City Council held its second Strategic Planning Session to reaffirm the City's long-term vision and set the direction for the year ahead.

The Council updated the four priorities for 2026/2027, which are as follows:

1. **Revenue Measures for 2026**
2. **40th Street Redesign**
3. **Resources for Sutter Health Development**
4. **Art Center Project**

EMERYVILLE

A SMALL CITY WITH A BIG STORY



Coastal People

These new arrivals occupied the area for another 1,200 years until the arrival of the Spanish in the 18th century. The Spanish referred to them as Costeños, or "coastal people," which was later Anglicized to Costanoan. Today, the preferred name for these indigenous people is Ohlone, although that term might have originally derived from a Spanish rancho called Oljon, and referred to a single band that inhabited the Pacific Coast near Pescadero Creek on the San Francisco Peninsula. Rather than a single tribe, the Costanoan or Ohlone people were actually a language group of approximately 50 different nations or tribes with about 50 to 500 members each and an average of 200, who inhabited the area from San Francisco Bay to the Big Sur coast prior to Spanish settlement of the area.

The Ohlone sub-group that occupied the East Bay west of Mount Diablo was known as the Chochenyo. Since the terms "Costanoan" and "Ohlone" are both of Spanish origin, it has been

suggested that a more appropriate name for the indigenous people of the East Bay might be "Muwekma," which means "the people" in the Chochenyo language.

The Ohlone subsisted mainly as hunter-gatherers and harvesters. They inhabited fixed village locations, moving temporarily to gather seasonal foodstuffs like acorns and berries. Cultural arts included basket-weaving, seasonal ceremonial dancing events, female tattoos, ear and nose piercings, and other ornamentation. The Ohlone villages interacted through trade, intermarriage and ceremonial events, as well as some conflict.

Disruption of the Indigenous Culture

Spain claimed what is now California and began to build a network of religious outposts, arriving in Ohlone territory in 1769. Spanish mission culture soon disrupted and undermined the Ohlone social structures and way of life. Spanish Franciscans erected 7 missions inside the Ohlone region and brought most of the Ohlone into these missions to live and work. The Chochenyos of the East

Bay moved en masse to Mission San Francisco de Asís, founded in 1776 in San Francisco, and Mission San José founded in 1797 in what is now the City of Fremont.

Most were baptized and were educated to be Catholic "neophytes," or "Mission Indians," until the missions were discontinued by the Mexican Government in 1834. Then the people found themselves landless. A large majority of the Chochenyo died from disease in the missions shortly thereafter. The speech of the last 2 native speakers of Chochenyo was documented in the 1920s. Today, the Chochenyo have joined with the other San Francisco Bay Area Ohlone people under the name of the Muwekma Ohlone Tribe and are currently petitioning for U.S. federal recognition.

BAG DISPENSERS

Emeryville parks feature bag dispensers for pet waste. These stations provide free bags to help dog owners clean up easily and responsibly. Proper disposal keeps our parks clean, protects local waterways, and ensures these spaces stay safe and welcoming for everyone.

MEASURE B & BB FUNDING

In November 2000, Alameda County voters approved Measure B, a 0.5% sales tax, to deliver essential transportation improvement and services. In November 2014, voters approved Measure BB which provided a 30-year extension of the 0.5% sales tax and added an additional 0.5%.

In November 2010, Alameda County voters approved the Vehicle Registration Fee (VRF) Program, authorizing the collection of an annual vehicle registration fee which began in May 2011. Measure B, BB, and VRF funds are distributed by the Alameda County Transportation Commission and have supported many of the pedestrian, bicycle, and street facility upgrades that have happened across Emeryville including: the Quiet Zone project, annual street repaving, multimodal safety improvements, and bike parking facility installations.



Each year, the City of Emeryville receives approximately:

- \$500,000 in Measure BB funding to improve and maintain our local streets and roads
- \$50,000 in Measure BB funding to construct and upgrade pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- \$60,000 in Measure BB funding or paratransit assistance to aid in the mobility of seniors and persons with impairments
- \$45,000 in Vehicle Registration Fee funding to reduce congestion and vehicle pollution.

RECYCLE BATTERIES

Residential properties with gray recycling carts can recycle batteries for free. Tape a sealed clear plastic bag of batteries (alkaline, button, rechargeable, or cell phone) to your cart and set it out on your regular collection day. Property managers of other residential buildings can contact Waste Management at (510) 613-8710 for free disposal options.

TFCA FUNDING

In 1990, AB 2766 was signed into law. This bill authorizes the California Department of Motor Vehicles to impose a \$4 vehicle registration fee on cars and trucks registered within the Bay Area Air District (BAAD). This fee supports the Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA), which funds transportation projects that reduce motor vehicle emissions. Approximately \$1.8 million in TFCA funding is distributed annually, with 60% of the funds awarded to BAAD through the TFCA Regional Fund and the remaining 40% passed on to the Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC). ACTC then distributes this funding to cities. TFCA funding has supported key projects across Emeryville such as:

- South Bayfront Bridge Project (completed), \$105,000 received
- 40th Street Multimodal Project, \$172,000 secured for Construction

LOSE THE BAG, FREE YOUR RECYCLABLES!

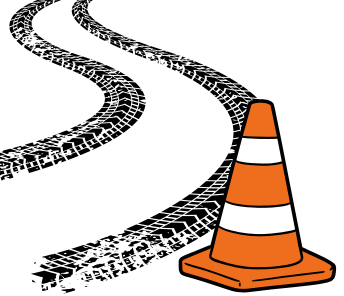


Plastic bags might seem handy, but they actually pose significant recycling challenges. When you bag your recyclables in plastic, it makes it harder to transform cans, bottles, and paper into awesome new stuff. If you collect recyclables in a bag, empty them directly into your cart and reuse or throw the bag in the trash.

- Recyclables must be loose to make their way through sorting equipment. This is because plastic bags and plastic films get wrapped around equipment at the facility, making the process time-consuming and dangerous for facility staff.
- Plastic bags contaminate recyclables, making it impossible to give these materials a second life.

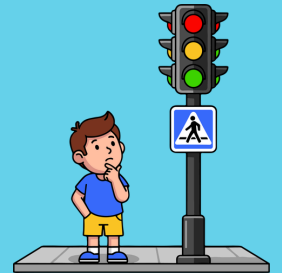

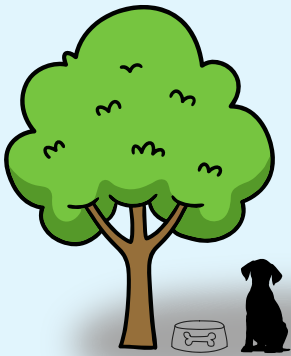

- Bright red gums



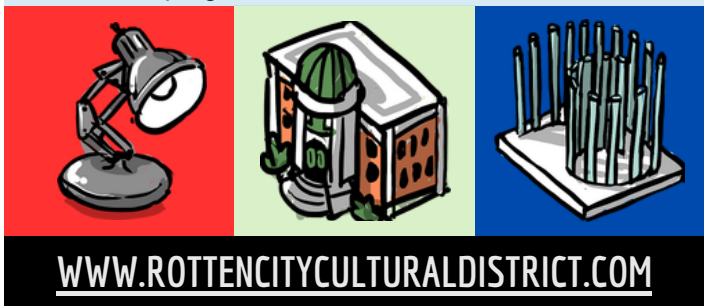

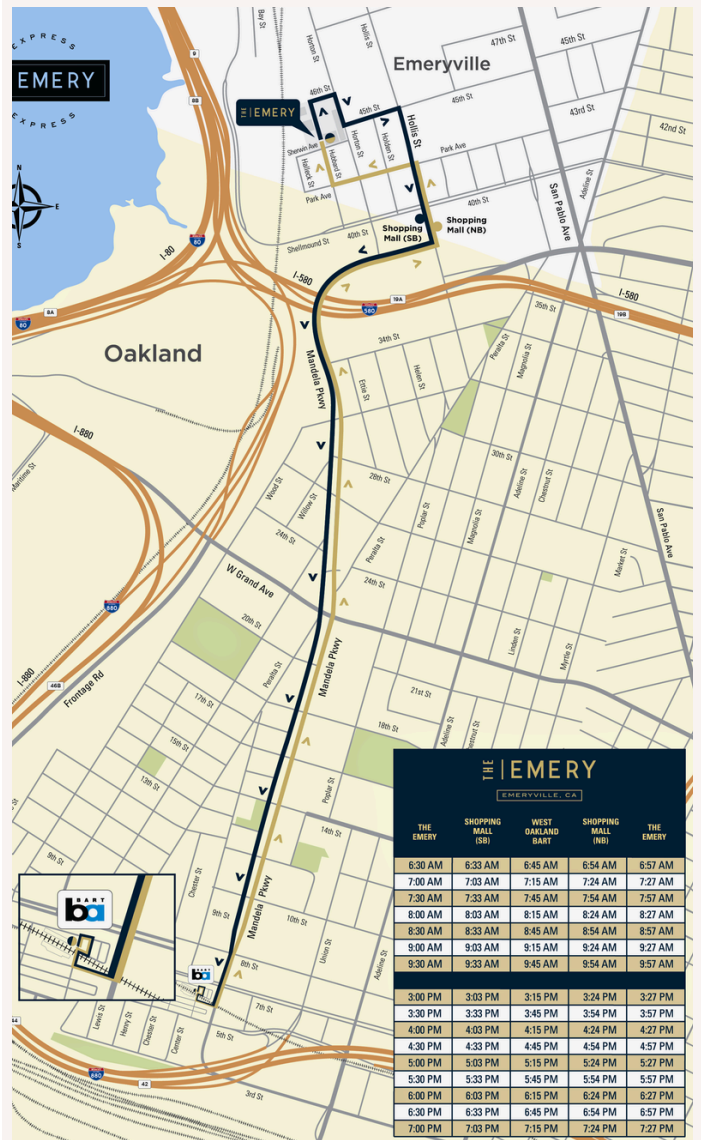
Emery Go-Round

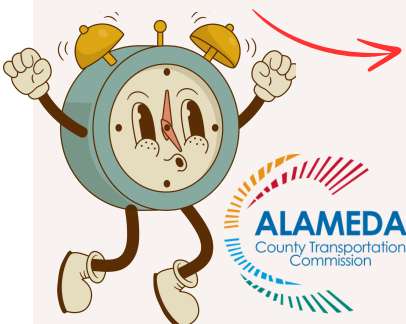
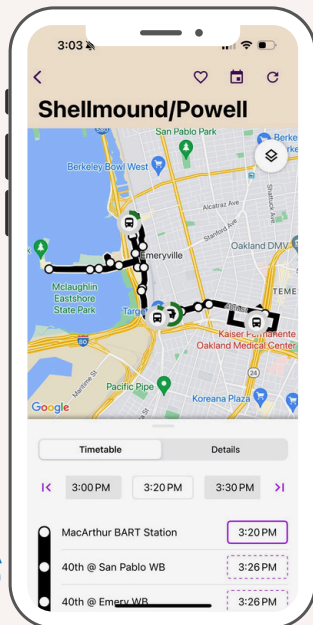

EMERYVILLE Bike Share Stations

In October, 2025, three new bike share stations were added in Emeryville!

This expansion was part of a system-wide expansion of the Bay Wheels bike share program operated by Lyft. Emeryville now has a total of 15 stations, and there are over 500 stations between San Francisco, Daly City, Oakland, Berkeley, and Emeryville. These stations connect to other transit (BART, Busses, and ferries), parks, neighborhoods, and popular destinations.

You can use the new Emeryville stations at:

- Huchiu park
- Powell Street at Commodore (near the Police Department)
- Vallejo Street at 66th Street

Some of the nearby stations you can ride to include:

- The Amtrak Station (59th Street at Horton Street)
- Emeryville City Hall (Park Avenue at Hollis Street)
- ECCL (across San Pablo on 47th Street)

How much does it cost to use Bay Wheels?

If your household qualifies for CalFresh or PG&E CARE, you qualify for the Bikeshare for All program. Bikeshare for All members only pay \$5 for the first year of membership, then \$5 a month after that (with no annual commitment).
