NOTICE: Ventura County's Fraud Notify Program Has Been Canceled



The Ventura County Clerk-Recorder has officially ended its Fraud Notify service, which was a complimentary real-time alert system created to inform homeowners when documents are recorded under their name.

WHY IT WAS CANCELLED

- Performance Issues: The system frequently failed to provide alerts as expected.
- **Privacy Concerns**: Anyone could sign up for notifications about any name, without any means to verify their identity or intent.
- Given these issues, the County concluded that it was not in the best interest of constituents to continue using the system.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO STAY PROTECTED

Manual Monitoring Encouraged

We recommend regularly searching public records, similar to reviewing credit reports, to ensure there are no unauthorized recordings associated with your name or property.

Notices for Key Documents

The County Clerks office will continue to mail official notices any time a Quit Claim Deed or Notice of Default is recorded, two document types most commonly associated with fraud.

Report immediately

If you suspect a fraudulent recording, contact The County Clerks office immediately. They have partnered with the District Attorney's Office to provide support in investigating and resolving potential fraud.
