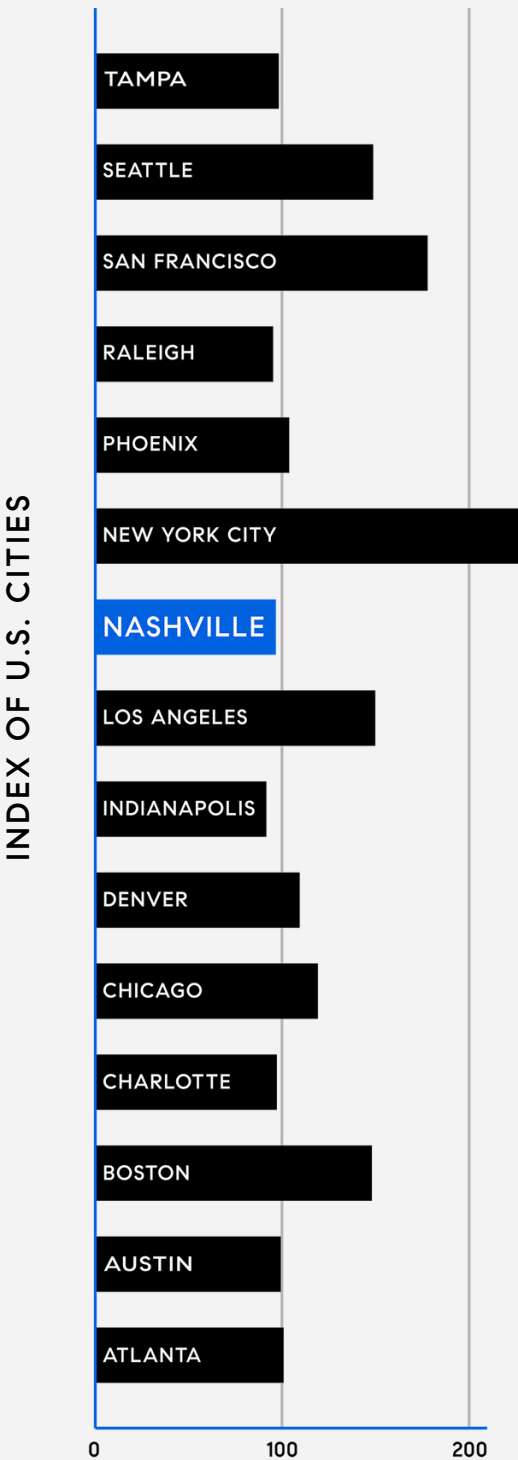

## DAVIDSON COUNTY

Davidson County is home to 24/7 live music, bustling nightlife, trendy boutiques, coffee shops, bars, and upscale restaurants. ## WILLIAMSON COUNTY

Williamson County cities, villages, and rural areas offer an entirely unique experience. Out of Nashville but still just a short drive from it, Williamson County is home to Middle Tennessee gems like Franklin, Leipers Fork, Thompson's Station, and Brentwood. Residents enjoy larger parcels in the rural paradise that this area is known for.

Tennessee's most affluent county is idyllic and peaceful, a living tapestry of rolling hills, farms, stables, and forested lands. 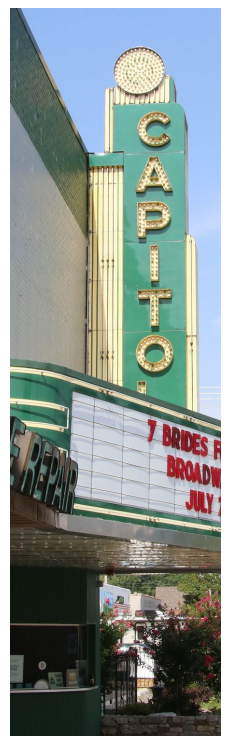
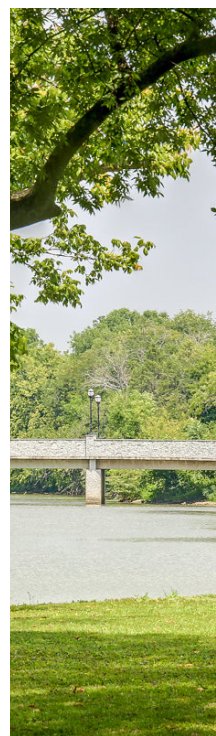
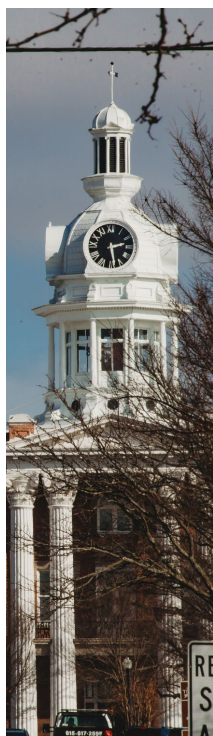
