Amelia Island

It is often said that Amelia Island is one of Florida's "best-kept secrets." After a visit to this 13-mile-long, two-mile-wide stretch of barrier island, you may understand why. Unlike the typical beach town, Amelia Island boasts a cooler, more seasonal climate, deep harbor waters and an enviable history rendering it one of the state's most distinctive and enthralling destinations. This coastal city at the northernmost tip of the state is a contender among its neighboring cities for setting down roots. The local economy comprises strong professional services, manufacturing, government, retail and hospitality industries, as well as thriving year-round tourism.

Surrounded by the Atlantic to the east, Intracoastal waters to the west, Cumberland Sound at the northernmost tip of the island, and the powerful currents of Nassau Sound embracing its southern border, this seaport island boasts breathtaking coastal beach scenery. There are a multitude of watersport activities such as boating, fishing, surfing, swimming and kayaking. In addition to biking and walking on the sandy shores, horseback riding is also allowed on most beaches. Easily accessible, Appalachian quartz beaches and sand dunes cover the perimeter, and 10% of the island consists of nature preserves.

Jacksonville

Featuring beaches, cultural attractions and a variety of parks and trails for passionate outdoor enthusiasts, Jacksonville, also known as "JAX" to the locals, appeals to both inquisitive travelers and those looking for a new place to call home. Located in Northeast Florida, a one-hour drive from the state of Georgia's southern border, the city covers extensive ground. With slightly cooler temperatures, Jacksonville represents the "largest city by area in the contiguous United States." Also known as the "River City" due to the mighty St. Johns River flowing through the region, JAX is regarded as the "Bold New City of the South" as a result of consolidation on October 1, 1968.

The area's lifestyle revolves around three bodies of water: the Atlantic, Intracoastal and St. Johns River. From these waterways spring various outdoor adventures and activities, catering to diverse interests and socioeconomic statuses. The city provides a plethora of other outdoor opportunities too, including boat excursions along the St. Johns River that traverse downtown, and a 3-mile-long river walk adorned with local landmarks. Along this route, you can also find attractions like the Riverside Arts Market.

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Clay County

POPULATION 226,589+

Southwest of Jacksonville and west of St. Augustine lies Clay County, a natural outdoor paradise offering a mix of rural and suburban living. St. Johns River runs along the county's eastern border, and the region is dotted with scenic undeveloped woodland.

Green Cove Springs, named after local natural springs, is the county seat. This small city is home to several parks, restaurants and museums. Residents seeking a taste of big city life can easily access nearby St. Augustine and Jacksonville from here.

With its small, quiet communities and outdoor offerings, Clay County is the perfect destination for families. Not only that, but there are many healthcare facilities and great schools in the county. When it comes to employment opportunities, the largest industries here include manufacturing, IT, aviation and defense, logistics, and others.





Ponte Vedra Beach

Ponte Vedra Beach stands as a seaside resort community within the Jacksonville area, gracing Florida's Atlantic shoreline. Established in 1928, Ponte Vedra experienced humble beginnings as a mining town after valuable minerals were discovered in 1910. Today, you will find some of the most luxurious resorts here, like the Ponte Vedra Inn and Club and The Lodge & Club Ponte Vedra Beach. Home to world-renowned golf courses and the PGA Tour, as well as the host of The Players Championship at Sawgrass, Ponte Vedra Beach is a place where you can rub elbows with professional golfers or play a few rounds with aspiring amateurs.

St. Augustine

St. Augustine is located between Jacksonville and Ponte Vedra Beach to the north and Daytona Beach to the south. With over 42 miles of barrier coastline, and a captivating city brimming with historical remnants, both residents and tourists are drawn to this region. Founded in 1565 by a Spanish admiral, it holds the distinction of being the oldest continually inhabited city in the U.S. The city's buildings, streets, monuments, art and architecture all reflect its deep Spanish roots. Referred to as the, "Ancient City" or "Old City", the core of St. Augustine includes one of its earliest structures, the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Augustine.

AN ENTHRALLING CITY FILLED TO THE BRIM WITH REMNANTS OF HISTORY

Flagler County

POPULATION 120,932+

Known for maintaining a feel of 'Old Florida', Flagler County lies just south of St. Augustine Beach and north of Daytona Beach. The 18 miles of shoreline and natural wonders attract relocators from all over the world, and the diverse neighbourhoods here offer a vast range of real estate opportunities.

Once a quiet fishing village, Flagler Beach is a seaside haven attracting a community of outdoor enthusiasts interested in great fishing and uncrowded beaches. Palm City is the largest city in the county and is known for showing off the best of Florida's native landscape, with its locals living among historic oak trees and indigenous vegetation. Similarly, Bunnell – the county seat – is known for its parks and natural attractions.

Residents of Flagler County find employment in industries such as tourism, healthcare, administration, retail, education and others. Agriculture also plays a significant role in the county's economy, a practice that dates back to the nineteenth century. A stop off Interstate 96, Flagler County provides residents with good transport links to other counties and cities along Florida's Atlantic Coast.

Palm Coast

Halfway between St. Augustine and Daytona Beach, the waterfront enclave of Palm Coast emerges as a haven of tranquility, embraced by an easygoing and amiable community. Once alandscape with tree-covered swampland, the 22,000 acres would eventually become Florida's first and largest master-planned community designed and built by the prestigious developers and builders, Levitt & Sons. Palm Coast has developed golf courses, country clubs, oceanfront hotels and a marina spanning thousands of acres. Enriched with unbelievable sunrises and magnificent vistas, Palm Coast is a sanctuary for those who call it home.

Most of the architecture of the Palm Coast region is Mediterranean Revival and Mission Revival with European and international influences from architects like Addison Mizner. Mizner is credited with creating the Florida style we most often see today, which incorporates tiled roofs, interior courtyards, and gothic, arched windows. Long gone are the traditional white-washed, shuttered New England colonials, saltboxes and the rows of townhouses of New York and Philadelphia. Mizner simply denied the status quo and went on to build some 40-plus unique mansions in his time. Alas, most of his mansions have been destroyed or altered and remodeled so much as to not be recognized in the original design.


COMMUNE WITH NATURE | PRISTINE WHITE-SAND BEACHES

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
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LAY OF THE LAND






