Cleaning Up


- Drop a bowl of vinegar in the microwave and heat for 3 minutes—steam loosens grime so you can wipe it clean effortlessly.
- Toss lemon peels and ice cubes into the garbage disposal to sharpen the blades and remove odors.
- Place dryer sheets at the bottom of your trash can to absorb smells between bag changes.



- Sprinkle baking soda on mattresses, let sit for an hour, then vacuum to remove odors and moisture.
 - Clean your shower head by filling a plastic bag with vinegar, securing it over the head, and letting it soak overnight.
 - Remove water stains from wood furniture by gently rubbing with a mixture of baking soda and a few drops of water.

Cranberry Brie Bites



- 1/2 cup whole berry cranberry sauce
- 1/4 cup finely chopped, roasted, unsalted pecans
- 6 rosemary sprigs, cut into 1" pieces

1. Arrange a rack in center of oven; preheat to 375°. Grease a mini (24-cup) muffin tin with cooking spray. On a lightly floured surface, roll out crescent dough and pinch together seams. Cut into 24 squares. Press squares into prepared cups.
2. Cut Brie into small pieces and place inside dough. Top with a spoonful of cranberry sauce, pecans, and one piece of rosemary.
3. Bake bites until pastry is golden brown, about 15 minutes.
